

The renovated space and spiral staircase connect the two floors making a cohesive work space.


Presidents' Room

Our Presidents' Room has been transformed as a warm and inviting library. We restored the original floor and doors.






The doors in the Presidents' Room

Treasurer Charles J. Holmes was unquestionably the dynamic motivating force and dominant influence during the Bank's first fifty years. Elected to his post on November 8, 1855, Holmes deliberated for five days before accepting - at the age of twenty-one. In doing so, he inaugurated a priceless family banking tradition that may be without parallel in banking history. He was succeeded by his son, Charles L. and later followed by his grandson, Lincoln P. Holmes. In total, the family served 83 years of family association with the same Bank in the office of treasurer.

The calligraphic flourishes were used so as to ensure the vault was visible from outside the conference room.




Bogle Conference Room
